# **Greetings!**


Hello Leaders!

It is the responsibility of the unit to make sure that Scouts are signed up in the correct merit badges for the Patrol Pods that they have formed. The system is set-up with a waitlist feature so that you can sign up a whole pod, even if the session fills up.

Merit badge registration will be suspended from April 3-7 so that the camp management can make all of the necessary accommodations to try and get pods into their merit badge selections. You may be communicated with during this time to make adjustments. Final merit badge selections will be communicated with you by April 7.

## **Health Forms**

Changes in the Health forms requirements:

A, B and C are a must for anyone spending even one night. Tetnas shots are now required within 10 years for everyone spending the night. Please let everyone know of these changes now so that all are prepared for camp. Health form at:

### **DHHS**

DHHS (new name for DHS):

If you are a registered Scouter and have not had a lapse in BSA membership, a previous clearance is still valid.

If you are NOT a registered Scouter or you have had a lapse in registration a new clearance form is required. This includes visitors. Visitors without a form will need to be escorted by an adult from the unit who is cleared or they are not allowed into camp.

This is a secured sight for you to upload these forms 14 days before attending camp – no exceptions:

- ☐ Proof of BSA Membership for Adults

You may still want to bring your binder with you, but you will not have to turn any of them in once you have uploaded your health forms. In case of emergency that you have to take someone to the hospital we can print out your forms for you if you don't bring your binder.

\*Youth payments made after May 3 are subject to a \$15 per person late fee. Late fees do not apply to Arrow of Light Crossover Scouts\*
